WHAT'S THE QUEEN'S JUBILEE ALL ABOUT?

Queen Elizabeth II acceded to the throne on 6th February 1952 after her father King George VI died. She was crowned more than a year later on 2nd June 1953.

Jubilees are special anniversaries that mark major milestones in the reign of a Monarch, celebrating their life and service.

A SILVER JUBILEE CELEBRATES 25 YEARS. A GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATES 50 YEARS. A DIAMOND JUBILEE CELEBRATES 60 YEARS. A PLATINUM JUBILEE CELEBRATES 70 YEARS.

In 2012, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Pageant was reportedly the 'world's largest outdoor party', when more than 1 million people lined the banks of the Thames to watch 1,000 boats sail down the river!



In 2022, the Queen has become the first ever British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee after 70 years of service.

The celebrations to mark the milestone are happening in many countries all over the world.

One of the top things to do in London is to partake in afternoon tea. This is a tradition that dates back to the mid 1800s when one woman was hungry around 4pm and needed some tea and cake! There is quite a bit of history behind drinking tea.

TOP FACTS ABOUT THE CUPPA

- In England, we drink 165 million cups of tea a day.
- That's 60.2 billion cups a year!
- There are officially 207 different types of tea strainer.
- The first tea bags were made of silk.
- There is evidence in manuscripts that monks in a Benedictine Abbey at Tavistock, Devon, served bread with clotted cream and strawberry preserves to local workers who helped rebuild the Abbey after it was damaged in a Viking raid in 997AD.



The Queen got her first corgi for her 18th birthday in 1944, and has owned some every since. She currently has 4 dogs - 2 corgis, 1 dorgi (dachsung-corgi mix) and a cocker spaniel.

BIG BEN

Did you know that the name Big Ben only refers to the bell inside the tower?



BUCKINGHAM PALACE

It is the Queen's official residence and has 775 rooms, including 78 bathrooms.



TOWER BRIDGE

Did you know that it features over 31 million bricks and 2 million rivets.



ST PAUL'S CATHEDRAL

It is the 4th church to stand on the site. The previous one was destroyed by the Great Fire of London in 1666.



LONDON EYE

It is Europe's tallest ferris wheel and has more than 3.75 million visitors a year.



TOWER OF LONDON

It is a 900-year-old castle and fortress where the crown jewels are kept.



PALACE OF WESTMINSTER

This used to be where the Kings of England lived, but is now where the houses of Parliament meets.

THE SHARD

This is the tallest building in the United Kingdom. It is 309.6 metres high. The lifts move 6 metres per second!

WESTMINSTER ABBEY

The official name is Collegiate Church of St Peter at Westminster. Coronations are held here, the last one was on 2 June 1953 - for Queen Elizabeth II!





BRITISH PEOPLE WILL GIVE YOU YOUR SPACE

We live on a small island that is very densely populated, how do we manage? Well, by ignoring people we don't know and pretending they aren't there. If you want to start a conversation or ask a question remember to be gentle, smile with some eye contact, and then ask them something to break the ice.

BRITISH PEOPLE HAVE TWO PERSONALITIES

Don't be intimidated when you meet an English person and they seem perfect and polished they are showing you their 'best' selves as a sign of respect! They share the more casual side of their personality with family and close friends (arguments, weird jokes.)



REMEMBER TO BE YOURSELF!

Foreign visitors can often feel quite intimidated by English people, don't be frightened, remember you also have a fascinating life and culture that we want to learn more about. Making a friend from a different culture enriches our lives as well, so a small social gesture helps to bridge that gap between us both.

BRITISH PEOPLE ARE SHY!

English people are very shy and reserved, this can often come across as a bit cold and judgemental, try not to feel intimidated.

LONDON'S OWN

LONDON HAS ITS OWN LANGUAGE!

Growing up, I was used to hearing the sound of my family watch Only Fools and Horses, a TV show set in Peckham, South London. I would just love trying to figure out the different meanings for the cockney rhyming slang the characters used throughout the show. It's like a whole other language – a secret code just for London!

Cockney rhyming slang is a way of speaking that originated from East London in the mid-19th century. It was invented by market traders and thought to have first been used as a cant – a language created to conceal what was being said by passers-by. It is now widely used and understood throughout London and Britain.

Cockney rhyming slang works by using a phrase which rhymes with a word instead of using the word itself. For example 'butcher hook" (look) Nowadays, often even the rhyming part is left out – so someone may say "let's take a butchers" meaning "let's take a look." Here are some cockney rhyming slang favourites:

APPLES AND PEARS - STAIRS. ARMY AND NAVY - GRAVY BEES AND HONEY - MONEY BOX OF TOYS - NOISE CAN'T KEEP STILL - TREADMILL DOG AND BONE - PHONE TROUBLE AND STRIFE - WIFE JACK JONES - ALONE A LA MODE - CODE HAT AND SCARF - LAUGH

I'll always love learning and listening to cockney rhyming slang. I mean who wouldn't want to sit down with a nice cup of 'rosie lee' and have a 'hat scarf' over some of this wonderful 'a la mode' language!
